Participants gain hands-on experience in the arts, working closely with Byrdcliffe's small staff to assist in our organization's daily operations, including exhibitions, events, marketing and development. Internships can be focused to meet individual interests and availability.

Dates	November 2012 – April 2013
Commitment	1-3 days a week for a period of 3-6 months.
Deadline	Applications are accepted on an ongoing basis, but generally should be
	submitted 4-6 weeks before the proposed start date
Compensation	Interns may arrange to receive credit through their college or university.
	Participants may receive a small stipend to cover the cost of transportation.
Qualifications	Current students and recent graduates of undergraduate and masters
	programs are encouraged to apply, including (but not limited to) studio art, photography, design, art history, curatorial studies and arts administration.

Internship Description: Admin interns work closely with the Program Coordinator and Operations manager to in the following areas:

<u>Exhibitions</u>: Interns may assist in the installation of exhibitions and the production of supporting materials (binders, price lists, etc.). Interns may also help prepare for exhibition receptions and talks. <u>Events</u>: Interns assist in the coordination of artist talks, concerts, fundraisers, and other public programs, including research, set-up, and hospitality.

<u>Marketing</u>: Interns assist in the promotion of public programs, the AiR program and workshops through press releases, postering, calendar listings, and other forms of public outreach.

<u>Development</u>: Interns may assist in foundation research and membership mailings.
