- LLI is now under the umbrella of the Bard Center for Civic Engagement. CCE is currently revising its website and will add Bard LLI to the new website, with a link to our website.
- We increased our donation to CCE for the 2017-2018 year and received a thank you note, saying that the money had funded student participation in unpaid summer internships in programs that address issues affecting people around the world.
- The Curriculum Committee is trying new class times for SummerFest, to increase classroom time: Classes will meet from 9:15 10:30 a.m. and 11:00 a.m. 12:15 p.m., with a coffee break between them.
- The AV-Tech and Communications Committees are working on building a library of photos and videos of members, LLI events, presenters, and the Bard campus to use in our publications and on the website.
- Volunteer and Leadership Development surveyed new members about their reactions to the mentoring program. Most feedback was very positive.
