- LLI's donations to Bard have increased. We have directed funds to upgrade Bard classrooms with improved technology, to contribute to a fund for students' art supplies, and to help the Conservatory match the grant from the Mellon Foundation.
- Two member surveys are planned for the near future: one will ask for member experience with LLI (preferred means of communications, for example) and the other will ask about member skills and interests.
- Questions about parking and disability access were referred to the Planning and Evaluation team to come up with proposals to help our members get to classes and events.

# The Curriculum Committee's Complex Choreography

Every month year-round, the LLI Curriculum Committee, chaired by Anne Sunners, meets to choreograph the structure, content, and timing of a year's worth of learning opportunities, including fall and spring 7-week sessions of Friday, Saturday, and other weekday classes (on campus and off), as well as the shorter June array of classes. Most ideas for courses are put forward by individual committee members, who shepherd their offerings to completion

by serving as producers and as liaisons with the presenters. A few courses are developed and produced by LLI members who are not (yet!) members of the Curriculum Committee.

Once a topic has been proposed and accepted, and presenter(s) identified, the delicate dance of fitting it into the schedule begins. Presenters come from Bard College faculty, the LLI membership, and the community—about a third from each of those sectors. No one is compensated for his or her work, and delivering a full class or even a single lecture is demanding. The main priority in course selection and design, Anne says, "is meeting members' needs while providing academically sound course offerings." Evaluations have proved valuable in both guiding the committee for future offerings and in helping presenters sharpen their skills.

Anne has noticed that the number and quality of class offerings have expanded, along with the expectations of the LLI membership. The most popular topics are civic engagement issues, poetry, literature, art, and music, and the wide spectrum of science-related subjects in the Bard Masters sessions. Off-Friday courses, which run the gamut from hiking to various tours, have a devoted following, and the recently instituted Saturday classes and Summerfest short programs have also gained traction.
